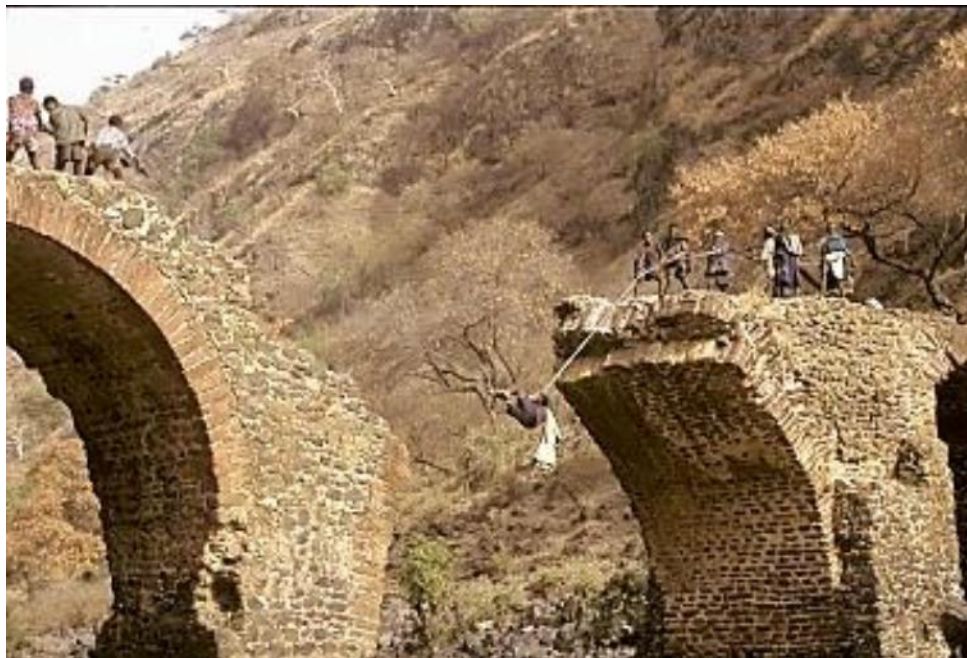


Why me? Why not me?

In Thornton Wilder's 1927 Pulitzer Prize-winning novel, *The Bridge of San Luis Rey*, a Franciscan monk witnesses five people fall to their death when one of the finest bridges in all of Peru collapses. Brother Juniper spends the next six years trying to answer the question, "Why these five people?" During this one-day luncheon seminar, we'll explore the random events that form the tapestry of our lives. We'll look at the larger backdrop of world events, and explore how these give context to the personal. We'll explore life maps through the narrative of personal geography. We'll reveal patterns woven into the seemingly random layers of our lives.
